Blessed Father's Day

This being the month of June and having a day designated as Father's Day, I thought I would share a popular story about a father.

The story is about a firefighter and how he had gone to a blaze, which was destroying a two-story home. Everyone had made it out when the smallest boy remembered something he had forgotten. Without anyone seeing him, he managed to make it back to his bedroom on the second floor. He made it in, but he couldn't get out.

Seeing his son at his bedroom window, the father shouted, "Jump, son! I'll catch you!" The boy cried, "Daddy, I can't see you!" "I know," his dad called back, "but I can see you."

BACKPACKS FOR HAITI

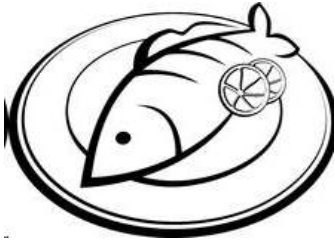
We will be shipping backpacks, used or new, to Haiti by the end of June. These will be given to children who have only a plastic bag in which to carry their school supplies.

WHAT: we are heading out to go paintballing

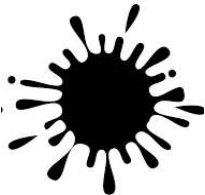
WHEN: June 25th
