Our group has approximately 10 individuals who meet for about 14 weeks, 7 in the Fall and 7 in the Spring, to assemble quilts. Each year 200 quilts and laprobes are made. Completed items are donated locally, nationally and in foreign countries. We encourage anyone to donate gently used cotton fabrics, sheets, yarn, dust ruffles, etc. which are used to make the guilts. Those do-

nations are greatly appreciated. Anyone interested in helping to assemble is encouraged to come and lend a hand with stitching, knotting, clipping or just joining in the fellowship. We will begin on Tuesday, September 8th at 9:00 am in Rooms 1 & 2. Hope to see you then!

The completed quilts will be displayed in the Sanctuary on Rally Day Sunday, September 13th and be available for purchase between services. The cost is \$45 for the large and \$35 for the lap blankets. Please spread the word! All proceeds will go toward the Orphan Grain Train.

ports and encourages our families and their youth. Also, like I always say... the best ministry that can occur for any family is to set aside 10-15 minutes each day to pray together, read a Bible story together, and commit some tenants of faith to memory like the Lord's Prayer, 10 Commandments, Apostle's Creed, or Psalm 23. Please have this habit in your homes!

If you are not signed up to receive our text and email blasts call Jean in our office to be put on those lists (715) 848-5511. If there are going to be any pertinent changes occurring, you need to be informed as plans seem to change quite frequently in these times. I'd encourage you to like our Facebook page for updates as well. Also, check out our "Currents" tab on the website for adult and parent resources to give you direction for growing in your faith at home.

We will have our final Voter's meeting regarding the Governance Model on Sunday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> right after the 2<sup>nd</sup> Worship Service concludes around 11:30. At this meeting we will be voting over whether or not to proceed with the new church governance model. **Please be there to vote as this is a very important decision for the church.** If you need to catch up on what is being done go to page 7 of this Markings, and you will find the direction you need.

Finally, I also want to mention the current Sound System that we are raising money for. The overall bid is for \$73,000 and we have about a \$8,700 start to chipping away at the overall amount. Our technology was about 10-15 years outdated. The video has been upgraded, as I'm sure you could tell, and now we just have the sound left.

We are in a crucial window to get this project completed. If, for COVID reasons, we could not worship for another large block of time, we could operate with fully updated technology. This would give the opportunity for people on the outside looking in to see and hear actually what is being done. Before the new camera was purchased, you wouldn't have been able to tell if I was making a face or not. I assure you I wasn't O, but the picture was literally that grainy. For sound, what you hear at home is a far cry from what you would hear at church, and that is because of very limited sound and recording equipment. No joke, once you hear the new equipment it will be a night and day difference.

Our hope is to have the new technology sometime in the Fall. Also, we have the ability to put the cost on a line of credit with the business orchestrating the entire process. That line, which has no interest attached, needs to be paid up by November. If you are able to give above and beyond to this necessary upgrade please earmark your giving as "Sound System."

As always, I am available by phone, office visit, or home visit. Please call if you need anything. I am available and at your service. I pray that you are all doing well. For those of you that have been missing coming to church, we miss you too, but above all we want you to feel safe and secure during these difficult times. Remember that God's Spirit is always with you, and all you need to do is take it to the Lord in prayer. Our Lord will always meet you where you are, and take you where you need to go.


