Dear St. Mark's family.

This last year has been difficult in many new and challenging ways, and this year will have its many challenges too. Yet, in these conditions St. Mark's is thriving because of the work and effort of God through His people in this church. We still have some time of endurance left, but when that time lifts I fully expect to hit the ground running. We have a solid base to build upon: a healthy and streamlined governance model, an awesome volunteer core, wonderful musicians, solid finances, a team oriented staff, and our perfect Savior at the center of it all.

There are lots of ministerial possibilities that have been put on the back burner during this time of Covid. Those same ministerial possibilities also require lots of time, effort, and planning to be implemented across the demographics of our congregation. The essentials are being done well and with consistency, but supplementing the areas we are lacking requires help. In order to meet the needs of the entire congregation, youngest to oldest, in making fully formed disciples who are followers of Jesus. We need help, and I need help!

A second pastor at St. Mark's would supplement the needs of this congregation for years to come. It would allow for two servants to take a team oriented approach in supporting what we already have going, and creating what we need going forward. Two pastors would share this mission allowing for two healthy individuals with two healthy families. Your prayers and support will be greatly appreciated as we travel down this road together!

As discussed at the November 15, 2020 Voter's Meeting, the Governance Team has been considering the future of St. Mark's and what that might look like in terms of pastoral staff. It was decided that it is now the right time, both financially and practically, to proceed with the Call process of an additional pastor. We will be having a special Voter's Meeting, which will be Live Streamed, **on February 21, 2021** starting at Noon. During this meeting Pastor Hauan will have a presentation with a Q & A afterwards. President Dwayne Lueck will also be available, either via phone or in-person, to assist with any questions. Some of the information presented will be:

- Explaining the process and need of the Call
- Giving a timeline in which we will be working within
- Presenting the Year End Review of the finances of the church

The Call Committee will consist of nine members. One member will be from the Governance Team (Dan Novitch), one member will be the head elder (see explanation below) and the other seven will be At-Large members. The chairperson of the Call Committee will be voted in by the Call Committee members themselves.

At this time, there have been twelve members selected and approved by the Governance Team to be an Elder. The Governance Team will now be selecting who they feel should be appointed as the Head Elder.

It is not only supplemental in my opinion, but also crucial to the spiritual growth of the blood bought child of God. I look forward in sharing, exploring and singing with you one of the greatest gifts in our church music, sacred lyrics of hymns.

First of all we thank the Lord for the many blessings we have received from His hand this past year as well as during the last 28 years since Orphan Grain Train's organization. This year's OGT work has looked different in many ways. Covid 19 has had its impact nationally at Norfolk, statewide with the Wisconsin Branch at Westfield, and at the local level here at St. Mark's. A smaller but faithful group of workers continue to keep OGT and its mission going. I am truly thankful for this dedicated group of volunteers here at St. Mark's.

The Orphan Grain Train's mission is: “In loving response to Christ, the Servant, the Orphan Grain Train movement encourages and enables God's people to share personal and material resources in bringing Christ's name and character to needy people, both far and near. Sometimes that character expresses itself as a word well spoken, sometimes as a bandage well applied, and sometimes as a child well fed.”

Our St. Mark's group fulfills this mission through the generous support of the volunteers who give of their time and talents, and by monetary contributions. Thank you to all those who:

- contribute clothes etc. that are clean, in good condition, and still usable,
- pick up boxes from super markets (which are used for packing),
- meet, accept, and unload deliveries from individuals, churches, and resale shops,
- pick up soap, shampoos, or linens from hotels,
- sort and pack soap, shampoo, and medical supplies,
- pick up clothes from resale shops or the Women's Community,
- tape and organize boxes for shipping,
- cut up and recycle the unneeded cardboard boxes,
- eventually load the semi-trucks which go to Westfield and then onto their final destinations.

A heartfelt thank you also goes out to our quilters who provide hundreds of 'made with love' quilts, and to those making pillowcase dresses and shorts which are sent as well. We were also able to ship some walkers, canes, crutches, wheelchairs, and other medical equipment. This last year 3 semi-trucks were loaded with a total of 2555 boxes! Praise the Lord!


In the past, OGT served an annual spring Fish Boil here at St. Mark's. Due to Covid restrictions we weren't able to do it last year but we hope to resume this tradition if not this year but May 2022 for sure. Funds raised at the dinners went toward shipping costs which average \$11.00 a box. Watch for future updates. We hope you can join us.

Our St. Mark's volunteer group put in almost 3000 volunteer hours in 2020. Their weekly dedication is a blessing to so many in need. In the words of Paul found in 1 Thessalonians 1:2 and 3: “We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers. We remember before God our Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.”

The work of the Orphan Grain Train has indeed been blessed here at St. Mark's as well as in the other 18 divisions throughout the United States. If you would like to get involved please contact me (715.842.4204).


