

BE GRACIOUS TO ME

PSALM 41

God's grace wells up in Psalm 41, where David exults in divine mercy amid his own weakness, powerful enemies, and treacherous friends. In this psalm, David tracks the flow of divine grace back to its source at the cross and, with prophetic vision, finds it springing forth in the lives of all baptized believers—including you.

How has God's grace raised you? If you haven't been set on a royal throne or made ruler over a great people, maybe you've seen improvements in your finances or employment. Or perhaps family strife has been quieted. Or maybe a compassionate helper or valuable ally has entered the picture at just the right moment. Have you shaken off a bad illness, a bad habit, or a bad influence? If so, rejoice and thank God for His grace and favor!

But if you feel like you're sinking instead of rising, what then? Is there any comfort for the saint of God who looks around to find that "the waters have come up to my neck" (Psalm 69:1)?

Lent is the ideal time to meditate on David's ordeals and your secure position in Christ. Psalm 41 provides the ideal guide to your meditation. If the laments of Psalm 41 call to mind your numerous difficulties and need for deliverance, they depict even more clearly the work by which your deliverance has been won.

Because you are in Christ, you share in all things with Him, even the prophetic Word. David's vision in Psalm 41 has become your reality in Christ. In the day of trouble, the Lord delivers you; the Lord protects you and keeps you alive; you are called blessed in the land (see Psalm 41:1–2). Press on to know the Lord's suffering, death, and Word. As surely as the Lenten journey ascends to the victory of Easter, you shall be raised up. Read and meditate on Psalm 41.

One of St. Mark's local missions is The Hagar House, a Christ-centered home for single moms with children. Their vision began in the fall of 2020 and continues to be a grace-based community of support, offering rest and resources to equip and empower single mothers

and their children. The home is located in downtown Wausau on the corner of 5th Street and Fulton with 4 families living there at this time. Currently funds are being raised to upgrade the electricity, windows, and insulation for the home.

Jessica Bretl, director of The Hagar House, will join us for worship at St. Mark's on February 25th. She will share current information and answer questions between services that morning. Plan now to join us.



Orphan Grain Train + 2023 Recap

What a year of blessings through Orphan Grain Train! THANK YOU ALL! The mission has remained the same since 1992: Bringing Christ's name to needy people through our material resources both far and near. Because of the generous, faithful support of so many volunteers here at St. Mark's, we are able to fulfill this mission. Thank you specifically to those who:

- pack weekly on Monday mornings sorting, labeling, and taping.
- pick up weekly from local resale shops.
- deliver from resale shops in Merrill, Tomahawk, Eagle River, and Rice Lake throughout the year.
- pick-up boxes from local grocery stores.
- pack soaps, lotions, shampoo, and health items.
- donate medical supplies and equipment.

Recapping St. Mark's OGT activities from 2023:

- 5,261 boxes packed.
- 4,270 volunteer hours in 2023.
- Over 275 beautiful quilts sewn by faithful and creative quilters.
- All shipments include blankets and quilts. What a blessing to all who receive them.
- 100s of pillowcase dresses, shorts, and backpacks made and sent.
- St. Mark's members, and other churches and organizations throughout northern Wisconsin consistently donate needed items.
- 444 pairs of children's socks were donated with the help of a Thrivent Action Team.
- 200 pairs of men's socks donated by Weinbrenner Shoes of Merrill.
- Vitaliy and Natalia Smolin visited St. Mark's where they shared their ministry and challenges in Ukraine a morning that certainly touched our hearts and minds.

Wisconsin Branch (headquartered in Westfield) highlights:

- 19 containers sent to Ukraine, Moldova, Lithuania, Republic of Georgia, Peru, Kyrgyzstan, Liberia, and South Sudan.
- 34 semi-loads to missions in the United States.
- Next to the national headquarters in Nebraska, the Wisconsin Branch is the most active in the US.
- The new warehouse in Westfield has streamlined our packing process.
- Two containers were sent to Maui after the fires there.
- Each of the 6 Texas missions received 40,000 pounds of potatoes.
- The Bush Bean Company donated 2 semis of Bush Baked Beans.
- The Minnesota North and Wisconsin Branches sent 40,000 pounds of pinto and black beans.
- Thousands of infant and adult diapers sent in containers.
- Rice meals are included in almost all of our shipments.
- Sewing machines and mobility carts donated and shipped.

There are many people in the world living in desperate conditions with a lack of food, clothing, and water. Many also don't know Christ. Pastors, missionaries, and Christian workers at the delivery sites get the opportunity to share Christ and His love through your Orphan Grain Train donations. All glory to God!


