Greetings St. Mark's Families!

It's hard to believe almost two years have gone by since I joined the ministry team at St. Mark's. I am so thankful for the relationships that have been built for my family and so many members of this place.

When I began in June of 2022, my position of Director of Family Ministry was in many ways left open-ended, as Pastor Eric and I explored the immense potential of this ministry for the glory of God. As I look back at my short time here so far, it's incredible to see the amount of ways God is choosing to move in this place. In just two years, well over 100 people have joined St. Mark's. High School mission trips, Bible study, Vacation Bible School, and family events like Trivia Night have all started up while existing programs like Sunday School and Midweek have increased in attendance. The expansion of our preschool program continues to open up more opportunities for our ministry. We raised over \$60k for a new welcome sign that was installed in March. Thanks be to God as He continues to grow this ministry in these and many more ways!

While my role at St. Mark's continues to be very fluid, I have spent about half of my time developing and leading ministry programs, and half my time working behind the scenes in an administrative/operational role. Operational pieces include website development, negotiating the welcome sign purchase, welcome sign content, general marketing and communications, and =developing systems ministerially that unify the people of St. Mark's toward accomplishing our mission of Reaching the Lost and Strengthening the Saved.

Pastor Eric and the governance team have recognized how critical it is to have such systems in place with membership continuing to rise and the incredible amount of volunteers and eager leaders we have among the congregation. Because of this, my role at St. Mark's is going to pivot into a Director of Ministry Operations position. Many of the tasks associated with this new role I am already doing, but additional pieces would include serving as a staff liaison to governance and the trustees, strategic planning, and becoming more involved in overseeing the operational affairs of the church. Taking on these responsibilities will create space for Pastor Eric to focus on his call to shepherd the people through the Word and Sacraments as well as galvanize both the church and preschool, as we are all one ministry.


