

He and his wife have raised four biological children, two adopted children, and nine others who lost their parents.

This past year, Pastor Kollie was overwhelmingly elected Bishop/President of the Lutheran Church of Liberia. He will also share how Orphan Grain Train has helped support his congregation, school, community, and beyond — meeting both physical and spiritual needs.
