It has been some time since I have composed my thoughts into a Marking's article. Celebrating our 75th Anniversary throughout this church year has had most of our articles revolving around remembering our past that has led us up to the present. So I thought it would be fitting to jump back into the present and take a look at what is going on right now and what also could be coming up this year.

I will start out by saying how blessed and thankful I am to serve St. Mark's! I greatly appreciate our ministerial staff, our preschool staff, and all the volunteers of St. Mark's to whom I get to serve alongside day in and day out. The amount of gifted people in this church, with servant-minded hearts, is humbling and motivating and quite frankly compels me forward to do the best job I can both up front and behind the scenes.

If you have been a part of St. Mark's for a long time or if you are new to this family of God, I hope you can see and experience how blessed we are across the board. To truly be healthy in all areas of the ministry, though not perfect, but healthy...that is a rare thing, and we are seeing and experiencing the results of those blessings. We are supported with so many awesome volunteers, generous gifts, and new people coming in to experience it all with us, and it is always my hope that we are never simply just going through the motions.

Our leadership has been watchful and intentional about making sure we stay ahead of these blessings so that the blessings of more people cannot become overwhelming for the congregation in terms of parking, internal space, and our ability to integrate everyone into our family of God. If there is one thing I can assure you, it is that we aren't doing it perfectly, but we are trying our best. In our efforts to do our best, we have two big plans we are pursuing this year. The first is another pastor from our Seminary in St. Louis. Lord willing, we will have a graduate gifted to us this summer to be Ordained into God's Church and Installed into our congregation. This man, whom the Lord has in mind for us, will be blessed to serve you all and grow in this church. I am very hopeful and optimistic for not only who we will get, but how they will grow to love this community and congregation.

Lastly, our other plan is to evaluate and change the building footprint through expansion and remodeling, which we hope to begin this summer. A congregational vote was recently passed to go ahead with this project. The next steps are twofold. We will be taking a deeper dive into the design of the church, and we will certainly be getting congregational input throughout it all. Our Church Expansion Committee, and especially Tom Radenz, have put in a lot of time to be as transparent and intentional as we can to bring everyone along. The current price tag for the project is 3.25 million, and we are tasked at raising 20% of that before construction permits are pulled. That can be an intimidating number when we only consider ourselves, but strength in numbers should give us all confidence in ourselves.

MIA Quarterly Report

Men In Action is a group of men at St. Mark's that meets every Tuesday morning at 6:30 am (yes, a.m.) to pray and study scripture. During October, we finished our in-depth study of the book of Daniel and were all pleased with what we had learned with the aid of ChatGPT through an LCMS lens. Before moving back in Biblical time into the book of Ezekiel, we spent 3 weeks to investigate the Qur'an to learn more about Ala, Mohammad, and Islam. As Christians, our duty is not to ignore or harm Muslims but to convert them, sharing the true gospel and surrendering them to the Holy Spirit. We all learned so much and are better equipped to converse or debate with them in a loving manner.

The MIA is about acting on our faith. On October 19th, we held our 25th+ year of The Great Pumpkin Giveaway at Diamond View Apartments. Starting with \$250 from Thrivent Financial for candy, nourishing food, and scriptural handouts to add to 30 quilts sewn by Rita Woller and Kim Grosskreutz. December found us deep into Ezekiel's 48 chapters of prophesy, and we served two more meals at WMC shelter plus a spaghetti dinner at our own church during Advent.
