After the death of Someone Loved, it’s normal to feel that part of your life ended with theirs. However, some people describe extraordinary “signs”, messages or dreams that can’t be explained. Grief has a way of making us more aware of sensations around or within us. This may cause us to notice coincidences we may otherwise overlook. Some signs may be familiar such as smells, sounds, or objects. Ultimately, the desire to maintain a bond with our loved one can be beneficial to healing grief. Whether you are a skeptic or a believer that those who passed can communicate in subtle ways, it would be hard to deny when it happens. These symbolic messages provide a sense of strength and comfort, reminding us that the spirit continues to endure. Though science may not be able to validate such experiences, we can be assured that we are all connected to something bigger than the small world we live in. Don’t think, “Maybe I imagined it.” Accept it and learn more how these signs offer comfort that death doesn’t end a relationship.

Spotlight: Blessing Bags

This month, our Mission Corner shines a spotlight on those in need in our community with **Blessing Bags** for the homeless or those down on their luck.

These are Care Packages filled with essential items: Shirt & socks, toiletries, hygiene products, non-perishable snacks, resource card for area services. Feel free to take one to keep it in your vehicle to hand out to someone in need.

Spotlight: The Babies Place at The Neighbors Place

The Neighbors Place has a program for new mothers and their babies to provide diapers and products to help care for them. We are starting a literacy component with board books (harder cardboard for babies to handle).

Spotlight: New Beginnings for Refugees

New Beginnings for Refugees is a local organization that supports refugees in the Wausau area. They are welcoming new arrivals in September. They are especially in need of: Fry pans (no Teflon), saucepans w/ lids, stock pots, tea kettles, cookie sheets, casseroles (med), mixing bowls – large, dish drainers, scrub buckets – 3.5 gal., NEW mops, NEW bed pillows, NEW queen sheets, NEW bath / hand towels, 1st aid kits, spatulas for turning food (nylon, Silicone or metal).

How You Can Help?

- Take a **Blessing Bag** to keep in your vehicle to give to a person in need.
- Bring in a board book to share a love of reading with **The Babies Place**.
- Bring in items for **New Beginnings for Refugees** by June 29.
- Pray for our mission projects and those we serve.

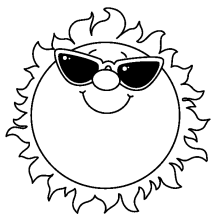
