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*And how are they to hear without someone preaching?
And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is
written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the
good news!" - Romans 10:14-15*

Preaching. It's a task that every pastor takes seriously. It's a task that requires hard work, deep study of the Scriptures, and knowing the people you are proclaiming to. At the seminary, it's one of the first courses you take because of the importance of the task. Week in and week out, pastors prepare to proclaim God's Word to God's people. It's an honor, and certainly it's something we don't take lightly.

In a couple weeks, I will get to deliver my first sermon here at St. Mark's. Don't worry, it's not my first sermon ever. Unfortunately, my classmates at the seminary had to sit through that one. But it is the first time I will get to preach at the place where I have been called. Over these first few weeks, I have begun getting to know some of you. Many of you have shared stories, encouraging words, and have already reminded me just how incredible our God is. To proclaim that same God on Sunday morning is both a joy and an honor.

Pastor Eric and I recently sat down to plan out our sermon series that will start on Rally Day, September 13th. The title of the series is "Personal Space." Together we will look at different spaces where God revealed Himself and where he continues to reveal Himself. We will explore different stories where God shows up in the lives of His people and learn from the different spaces He occupies. Over eight weeks, we will dive into the story, beginning in the Garden when God created time and space and ending by reflecting on the space of the New Heavens and the New Earth where our hope is surely secured. I look forward to diving into the different stories and connecting God's eternal truth to your life.

At the beginning of Romans, Paul describes the Gospel as "the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes" (Romans 1:16). In chapter ten, he reminds the Romans that they hear the good news from those God sends to proclaim it. Whether it's me, Pastor Gary, Pastor Eric, or whomever else God has called to proclaim that news to you, always remember, the power comes from His Word alone. I look forward to proclaiming that powerful Word in the coming weeks, months, and years ahead.

YOUTH PROGRAMS AT ST. MARK'S

RALLY DAY (the kickoff of Sunday Youth Programs) IS SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 13. NEW THIS YEAR – PREK-8TH GRADE YOUTH AND PARENTS - PLEASE GO TO THE FELLOWSHIP HALL AT 9:15AM FOR AN INTRODUCTION OF THE TEACHING STAFF. FROM HERE, THE STUDENTS WILL BE DISMISSED WITH THEIR TEACHERS TO THEIR ROOMS AND THE PARENTS WILL MOVE TO THE SANCTUARY FOR OUR PARENT/GUARDIAN ORIENTATION MEETING. Nursery for 0–3-year-olds will be open at 9:15AM.

Sunday School

We will begin Sunday School for PreK - 5th grade students on Rally Day (Sunday, September 13). Sunday School is a highly effective way for children to familiarize themselves with the names and stories of the Bible, and all St. Mark's kids are strongly encouraged to attend regularly.

Middle School Christian Growth

Christian Growth will begin on Rally Day (Sunday, September 13) for all students in grades 6-8. The purpose of this time is for students to grow in their faith together as they navigate the turbulent waters of Middle School. It's such an important time for a child to stay grounded in faith, as so many other parts of life can seem up in the air.

Midweek

Midweek is a program for 4th-7th grade students that takes place on Wednesday nights during the school year from 6:45pm – 8:00pm. Midweek will start up on September 16. This is a fun, intentional time for students to gather and dive deep into what it means to be a Christian and part of the church. Students should NOT expect an hour-long lecture after they've been in school all day. Midweek is a fun and engaging time focused on growth as a child of God and fellowship with other believers.

Confirmation

Confirmation for 8th graders takes place on Wednesday nights from 6:45-8pm during the school year. Class begins on September 16. Confirmation is an intentional point in a journey that began for your youth in the waters of Baptism and continues on into the rest of their lives. Confirmation is confirming what God has done in the life of the Catechumen. God has made them His children and surrounded them with family, sponsors, and a church that has raised them up in the faith that is being confirmed in the promises of God. Sunday School and Midweek programs are the church's intentional effort to equip the parents and youth to arrive at Confirmation. **Every 8th grader and one parent is required to attend each class, complete the assigned homework, and prepare for the Final Questioning at the end of the year.** Upon being confirmed, a life of faith is then entrusted to our youth, and we pray that they will continue to run the race that is set before them.

High School

High School Youth Nights take place on Wednesday evenings from 6:45-8pm (starting September 16) and are a time for fellowship and community. There will be several service opportunities and fun excursions throughout the year as well on these nights. **High School Bible Study** will join with adult Bible study this year in the Fellowship Hall on Sundays from 9:15am-10am beginning on September 13.

SUMMER GREETINGS! It seems hard to believe that it is already the month of August! Our teaching staff will soon return to make preparations for the start of another school year as we prepare to welcome many new students to our St. Mark's Preschool Family!



SUMMER CAMP: Our third week of Summer Camp was "*Classic Tales and Timeless Adventures*" led by Mrs. Arneson. The students made lots of fun projects as they learned these popular fairy tales: Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Jack and the Beanstalk, The Three Little Pigs, and Little Red Riding Hood. They also learned these Bible stories and positive character traits that related well to the fairy tales: The Good Samaritan, David and Goliath, Nehemiah Rebuilds the Walls in Jerusalem, and The Calling of Samuel.

Mrs. Berens led our last Summer Camp on July 27-30 where the students learned about God's wonderful creation of "*Animals of the Land, Sea, and Sky*" with special emphasis on the Story of Creation and Noah's Ark. They had fun doing animal hunts in the Gym Room and spotted some creatures outdoors, as well.

All four of our Summer Camps were very well-attended, and our teachers did an amazing job leading so many fun and engaging activities! For many of the students who attended, it was their first preschool experience. Grief Education - "The Grief Slump"

"Grief Is a Lot Like a Hot Air Balloon" is an original grief-support program by Nan Zastrow that gently reframes the journey of loss through the imagery of flight. Just as a balloon drifts on winds it cannot steer, those who are grieving often feel carried by forces beyond their control — lifted by moments of hope and pulled down into the heavy "grief slumps" of exhaustion, sorrow, and weariness.

Rather than fighting the wind, the program invites participants to surrender to the path and notice how a little distance can shrink even the largest pain into something they can see beyond. Through story, metaphor, and reflection, it offers comfort, perspective, and the quiet reassurance that what brings us down for a while can take us up again — and that life can still be good.
