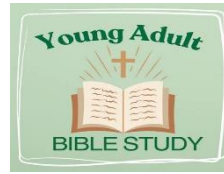

Mission Corner: Hearts in Action Connecting Our Church to Outreach Opportunities

Welcome to our **Mission Corner**—a dedicated space highlighting the outreach efforts and opportunities that connect our church family with our broader community and the world. Our church supports 22 different Missions, which we will be highlighting over the next year.



Mission of the Month: Orphan Grain Train (OGT)

Orphan Grain Train is a Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. OGT volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

St. Mark's is a packing station for OGT located in our church garage. Volunteers pack donations every Monday from 8:00-11:30. Once a month, a trailer arrives to pick up 200+ boxes to be taken to the Westfield Warehouse. From there, donations are sent to areas of need across the U.S. or abroad to 74 different countries.

ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN NEEDS:

School Supplies: pens, pencils, folders, washable markers, crayons, colored pencils, erasers, spiral notebooks (wide-lined), construction paper. ***For children living in poverty around the world.**



Hygiene Supplies: Bath towels, washcloths, bars of soap, toothbrushes, toothpastes, Band-Aids, Kleenex, nail clippers, deodorant.

Women's Sanitary Products: Sanitary pads and tampons of any size. *** Desperately needed by women living in poverty around the world.**



Each month we will be collecting your coins - **"Change for Change"** to support our Mission of the Month.

Our change in October will support **Mercy Meals** for OGT. **Mercy Meals** are highly nutritious, shelf-stable, fortified food packages assembled by volunteers to fight world hunger and severe malnutrition.

Who

Q: Who can participate in the ministry?

A: Men and women, in the rough age range of 18-mid 30's

Mission

Q: What is the mission of the young adult ministry?

A: Similar to St. Mark's mission, our mission is to grow, bring, and build. GROW deeper to Christ, BRING others to know Christ, and BUILD community with each other

Structure

Q: What is the structure of the ministry?

A: Bible study is the 1st Thursday of the month. If you can't make it to every one, that's okay! Our current study is structured to be practical for life. It's a good study whether you are new to the Faith or have been a lifelong Christian- eliminating the "I don't know how to comprehend what is written." Fellowship/Activity is once a month, usually the 3rd Friday unless noted otherwise; we usually do the activity and end with devotion and prayer. We also provide childcare for both Bible Study & Fellowship!

Communication

Q: How do I stay in the loop?

A: Join our GroupMe- we promise not to blow up your phone 😊 All events and key event details will be posted there. You'll hear about events before they are shared in the bulletin. We also use it to let you know about any last-minute schedule/location changes. You can also connect with others if you wish.
